two brothers, Terry and Tom, known legally as WWTT Interiors, Inc., built the original 5,000 square-foot store in 1975 and have added to it over the years. Originally, the Olivers sold carpet-

ing, after the elder Bill traveled to mills in Georgia to find a carpeting source. In 1979, they began selling furniture and they made additions in 1980 and 1985. The current building is 15,000 square The younger Bill Oliver said he grad-

uated from Houghton Lake High School in 1976 and became store manager that same summer. He and his wife, Holly, a graduate of Livonia schools, were married in 1980. Their son, Bill Oliver III, graduated from HLHS in 1999.

Oliver said he appreciates "all the loyal customers who have supported us over the last 37 years." He and Holly both mentioned their certified floor installers, Clant Chenette and his brother, Jack Chenette.

Bill Oliver said he has given back to the Houghton Lake community in various ways. He has been a Houghton Lake Rotary member since 1991 and has served on the Denton Township Planning Commission since the early 1990s. He served as Tip-up Town mayor in 1997, along with his Marshal Jim Bowman. He has also volunteered with the UPS Ed Charities for many years.

"I'm not retiring," Oliver said, adding that he and Holly will need to keep working about six more years.

He said that big box stores and liqui-

dators have changed the flooring industry and that the cost of furniture has gone up, but not his profit margins.

"I'm disappointed," Oliver said. 'Flooring and furniture's been my life for all my life."

Comfort Suites Lakeside finishing \$250,000 in water park upgrades

Houghton Lake's Comfort Suites Lakeside hotel expects to complete nearly \$250,000 in upgrades to its enclosed water park and spa area before Memorial Day to make sure patrons have a fun water experience even when the weather isn't cooperating. The facility will be back in operation on May 24.

'As the largest inland lake in Michigan, Houghton Lake has always been a huge draw for vacationers who love the water," said Brooklynn Benson, manager of Comfort Suites Lakeside. "But we all know how quickly the weather can change, on some days by hour. So we invested in our facilities so patrons can use their swimsuits even when we get socked with temporary chilly weather."

The full-service resort hotel is restoring the water park that includes a lazy river for tubing and a three-story-high slide. An 18-foot-diameter ceiling fan has been installed to keep air circulating and humidity low.

'We're restoring the entire park, from the top ceiling lighting to the bottom of the pools," Benson said.

In keeping with its family-oriented range of services, the park has a shallow pool and hot tub designed for children in addition to its pool and hot tub for

With 70 rooms and meeting and banquet facilities that can accommodate up to 550 people, the Comfort Suites fullservice resort hotel has been a prime location in the Houghton Lake area for lakeside weddings, golf outings, business gatherings and special events. The Comfort Suites Lakeside is affiliated with the Comfort Inn, a nearby hotel with 69 rooms that serves value-oriented travelers and vacationers who want close access to Houghton Lake.
